Conclusion of "Memorandum of Collaboration on Infectious Diseases between the National Institute of Infectious Diseases, Japan and the Mongolian Academy of Medical Sciences"

The National Institute of Infectious Diseases (NIID), Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare signed on July 10, 2012, a memorandum for collaboration on infectious diseases with the Mongolian Academy of Medical Sciences (MAMS), Mongolia, at the Mongolian Academy of Medical Sciences (MAMS), Ulan Bator, Mongolia.

- 1. Summary of the Memorandum
- (1) Title: "Memorandum of Collaboration on Infectious Diseases between National Institute of Infectious Diseases, JAPAN and Mongolian Academy of Medical Sciences" (Original language: English)
- (2) Objective: "Both parties shall commit themselves to cooperation on the following matters, recognizing that building a framework for close cooperation between the two institutions is necessary to promote the health and welfare of the citizens of both countries, and thus the entire human population."
- (3) Details: "1) Joint research on infectious diseases, 2) Human resources development, 3) Sharing information on infectious diseases, etc."

2. Signing Ceremony

The memorandum was signed by Haruo Watanabe, the Director-General of NIID and Pagbajabyn Nymadawa, the President of MAMS.
