Preprint policy

The Japanese Journal of Infectious Diseases (JJID) publishes only original, unpublished work; however, manuscripts previously posted on nonprofit preprint servers (e.g., bioRxiv and medRxiv) will be considered. As defined in "Preprints for the life sciences" (2016, Science 352: 899–901), preprints are the author's version of a research manuscript uploaded to a public server prior to formal peer review at a journal. Preprints may be posted at any time during the peer review process and will not be taken into account when determining the advance provided by a study under consideration at JJID.

During the submission process, authors must indicate where their preprint has been posted, including the digital object identifier (DOI), in their cover letter. They must also agree, if their manuscript is accepted, to update the archived preprint with a publication reference, including the complete citation, DOI, and a link to the article published in *JJID*. Upon publication, the following text

should be added to the preprint:

This article has been published in [insert full citation] following peer review and can be viewed on the journal's website at [insert DOI].

Although authors may choose any public license they prefer when posting their preprint (including Creative Commons licenses), they must retain copyright of their work.

Preprints may be cited in the reference list of articles under consideration at *JJID*(See *JJID* "Instruction to Authors") .

To check whether posting a manuscript on a preprint server will affect its eligibility for publication, authors may contact *JJID* at jjid@nih.go.jp.
